

Literacy Center Quote Analysis


Set up the center

- Print the quote cards in this section on card stock. Cut each one out.
- Place them in a folder, three ring binder, or small photo album.
- Copy several Quote Analysis forms for the center.
- Copy the directions and frequently asked questions about the directions, and place them in a page protector in a three-ring binder.
- If you are using folders, you can tape these directions on the outside of the folder.
- You will need colored pencils or other art supplies for this center
- You may wish to display students' quote analysis and illustrations in a notebook. If so, place each one in a page protector so that the front and back can be seen.



Cut out each quote and place them in a small photo album. Students can flip through to find the one they want to use.


Inside the box, place directions, photo album, quote analysis forms, and colored pencils.








Frequently Asked Questions About Directions

Q. If I am working with a partner, can we use the same quote?

A. Yes, however, you must both tell what the quote means in your own way using your own words, and you must both do your own drawing of the quote.

Q. Can I choose any of the quotes that I want, or do I have to start with the first one?

A. You may choose any quote that you want.

Q. If I am working with a partner, can we choose different quotes?

A. Yes.

Q. What does the word analyze mean?

A. When you analyze something, you think about it, and tell what it means.

Q. How do I explain this quote?

A. Read it and think about what it means. Then, explain what it means to you. Use examples to fully explain yourself.

Q. How do I illustrate the quote?

A. Think about times that you have seen quotes with illustrations with them, like on a poster, Facebook, or Pinterest. Use the entire page. Write the quote neatly and large. Then, create a border or draw a picture to go with the quote.

Q. What do I do if I finish early?

A. First, read over your work. This is not a hard assignment, so make sure you are correct and have fully explained what the quote means. Color your picture or decorate your quote so that it looks nice. If there is still extra time, work on the early finisher work assigned by your teacher.
